

COVID-19 Safety Guidelines



Keller and Heckman is ready to safely host the attendees of our Practical Primer on Pesticides on March 10 – 11, 2022, in Washington, DC. These guidelines may be revised between now and the time of the in-person event based on updates from the CDC and local authorities regarding the COVID-19 pandemic. Any changes to these guidelines will be shared with all registered attendees.

Below is a list of current COVID-19 guidelines for attendees of our program:

- Keller and Heckman will request attendees to show proof of the COVID-19 vaccine or the results of a negative rapid or antigen COVID-19 test taken within 24-hours of the conference date. Please provide proof of vaccination or negative COVID-19 test results during the registration check-in process on Thursday, March 10th.
- In accordance with the hotel's policy, face masks are optional for fully vaccinated guests. Face coverings over mouth and nose are required for unvaccinated guests.
- If any attendee has symptoms or feels unwell, they will be advised to refrain from attending the program.
- There will be hand sanitizer stations throughout the hotel and all meeting rooms. The hotel is taking extra measures to clean tables and meeting rooms regularly.
- Plenty of supplies, such as face masks, hand sanitizer, wipes, tissues, etc., will be available at the registration desk.
- We have a response plan in place in the event that someone becomes ill with COVID-19 symptoms.
- We will encourage attendees to greet each other without physical contact.
- We will reinforce health and safety guidelines to all participants via email and arrival points in the meeting areas.

Keller and Heckman will continue to monitor CDC guidelines and state mandates in order to provide a safe and healthy environment for all attendees.

Personal Accountability Commitment

By attending our Practical Primer on Pesticides, you agree to abide by and engage in certain health-and-safety-beneficial conduct while attending the event.
