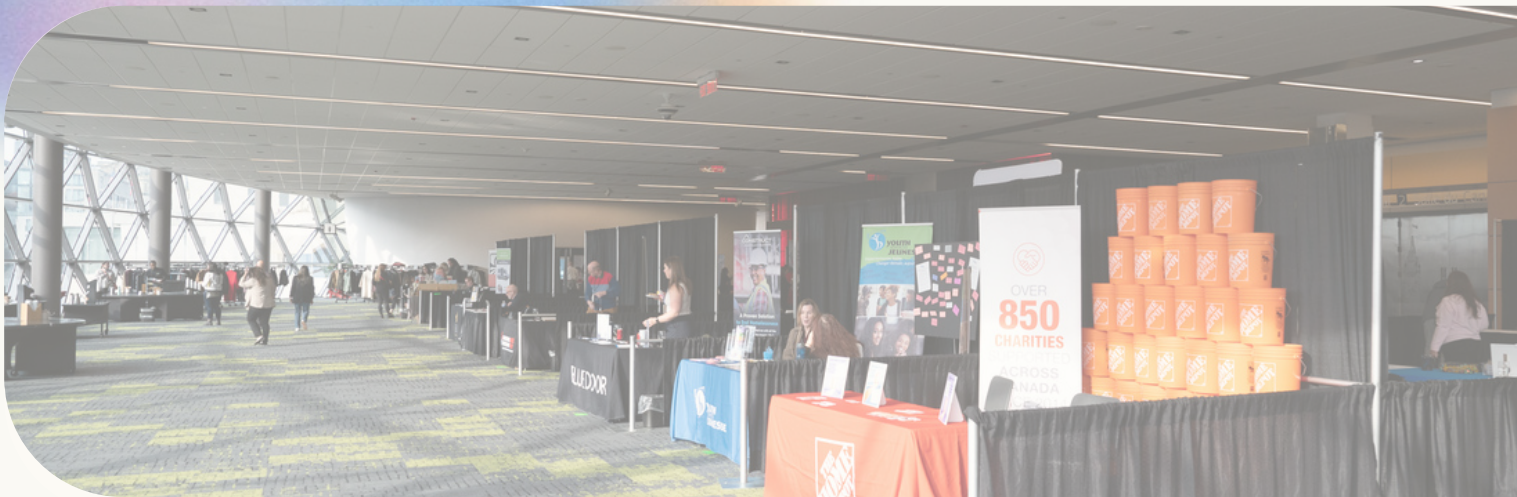

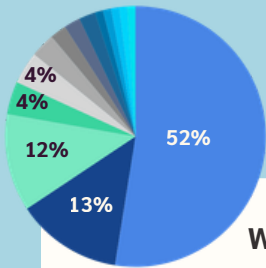
LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

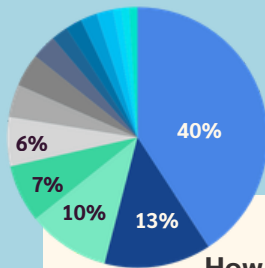
CONFERENCE PARTICIPANTS
