Review of IUR Modifications Proposed Rule (Final Rule) (Key Ballroom 6)

In August 2010, EPA issued a proposed rule modifying the reporting obligations under the TSCA Inventory Update Reporting (IUR) Rule which will take effect with the 2011 IUR submission. EPA is proposing to require electronic reporting of IUR information and to modify IUR reporting requirements, including certain circumstances that trigger reporting, the specific data to be reported, the reporting standard for processing and use information, and Confidential Business Information (CBI) reporting procedures. This session is intended to provide a comprehensive overview of the proposed (or final) modifications in an effort to assist those companies affected by this regulation.

OPPT is moving aggressively forward with plans to implement a paperless program by digitizing its legacy holding and systematically launching electronic filing capabilities for all TSCA reports. This year, efforts are underway to support the electronic submission of nearly all TSCA filings including the Inventory Update Rule, Endocrine Disruptor Screening Program, and TSCA section 4, 8(d), and 8(e) filings. This session will describe the opportunities, challenges, and timing of these efforts and discuss long-term plans to support electronic exchange of information with industry and the public.

Additionally, this session is intended to provide you with a better understanding of the EPA's proposed 2011 electronic reporting tool, e-IURweb. The Agency is proposing to have submitters use this free, web-based reporting tool to complete Form U for the 2011 IUR. EPA will provide an overview and interactive demonstration of the e-IURweb tool, including the enhanced CDX registration process, and will answer questions related to using the electronic tool.
