This event was organised by the Winnicott Study Group and the Scientific Committee from Sociedade Psicanalítica do Rio de Janeiro (Rio 1), with the Support of the Capsa Committee. It took place on May 14th, online, on Zoom, with simultaneous translation. Registration was through Sympla platform. We had two activities, requiring separate registration (due to confidentiality concerns for the clinical material).



The first one was a lecture, “A journey through Winnicott’s Use of an Object”, where Prof Abram presented a Power Point (translated into Portuguese by a translator and revised by the Winnicott Study Group) about Winnicott’s article on the Use of an Object, followed by a presentation of her own concept of Surviving Object and a clinical case from her most recent book. It lasted for 2 hours.

The second activity was a clinical one, where a candidate from our Institute presented 2 consecutive sessions of a case and Prof Abram commented in the light of the concepts from the first lecture.

As for publicity, we hired a designer to make the folders and also material for social media - all of them mentioning the CAPSA Committee. The material was made in Portuguese and in English. We posted it on Rio1’s Instagram, Facebook and website. It has also been sent to all Brazilian IPA’s Societies, to our own mailing list – WhatsApp and email – and to NAPsaC’s email list.

In the first event, we had 122 registered participants, among them there were IPA members and candidates from various Brazilian societies, psychoanalysts from non-IPA Societies, psychologists, doctors and students (of Psychology). For the clinical activity, there were 70 registered participants. Due to confidentiality concerns, this activity was restricted to professionals only (psychoanalysts – IPA and non IPA, psychologists and doctors).



In preparation to these events, the Winnicott Study Group held two meetings in April, inviting psychoanalysts from various Brazilian IPA and non-IPA Societies who were notoriously interested in Winnicott's work. This proved to be a very interesting interchange, as we read the clinical case Jan Abram was to present in her first lecture, having the opportunity to raise doubts and points for further discussion.

Both events were a great success, bringing a lot of positive feedback. We felt this was an important opportunity to strengthen the presence of the other theoretical streams of thought, mainly those belonging to the group called Independent. We also thought that these events were a great opportunity for our Society to be in touch with other psychoanalysts from various parts of our country, IPA members and non-IPA. The exchange was really interesting and most participants felt enriched by it.
