2- Content (topics, themes, etc.)

The First online meeting between the S.P.P and the Three Psychoanalytic Societies of Buenos Aires : A.P.A - APdeBA - S.A.P - took place on the 16th and 17th October 2021
We met on Saturday 16th October 2021 from 14h to 18h30 (Paris time)

And Sunday 17th October 2021 from 14h to 18h30 (Paris time). These schedules took into account the time difference between the two countries.

An opening panel was organized with the presidents of each society or their representative. After that, there were four panels. In each one, the four psychoanalytic societies were represented by colleagues from each society.

Some candidates had a specific role: They collected the interventions of the public and transmitted them to the chair of each table, thus facilitating the dialogue with the public. One of our main aim was to create bridges and open a dialogue between the two continents and with the audience.

The tittle of the encounter was :

An effractive reality

Reflections on the impact of reality on analytical work

The current health crisis has caused paradigm shifts, forcing us to modify our clinical practices and even our ways of life.

Even far from a metapsychological understanding in "après coup" and its elaboration, we can, despite everything, question ourselves about the consequences and clinical avatars of these violent alterations; and in a broader way on the impact of the effractive reality on the cure.

This meeting was part of the direct prolongation of the rich exchanges that began long ago between the S.P.P and the Argentina psychoanalytic societies.



However, this meeting has the particularity of having been imagined during the pandemic, as an attempt to transform current impossibilities and obligations into creative potentialities of exchange and thought.

The main thematic axes of our reflections were :

In what way do analysts on each shore of the Atlantic Ocean take reality into account? In what way are the historical, cultural and social imprints specific to each region inscribed in the understanding of our theories and in our clinic? What incidences have the changes of setting established during the pandemic had on the cure, but also those caused by migrations, wars and other outbreaks of reality? What tools do we currently have to think about them? Child and adolescent cures: what transfer-*contra*-transference dynamics? And in these particular circumstances, how is the work with the parents organized?

3- Publicity and outreach efforts and reflection on their success

4- Audience—who came, how many, how they received the program

The Encounter was free and only for members and candidates belonging to the IPA. The publicity was done by the four concerned societies. Each society published the event on its website in a stable manner for several months, including the flyer, the program and the argument. Also, each of these societies, through its newsletter, sent the event to its own members and candidates in a more personalised way. We have also contacted the FEPAL- the FEP- and the IPA and each of these organisations has placed on their website the promotion of the event in both languages French and Spanish, again including the flyer, the program and the argument.

535 colleagues from all over the world signed up. 460 were present, representing 31 countries from Latin America, North America, Central America, all Europe and the Middle East.

5-Outcome and ramifications for the society and community beyond the meeting itself

This meeting allowed a strengthening of the influence of psychoanalysis even beyond our expectations. The fact that it was free and zoomed allowed many colleagues from different countries to participate.



6- Recommendations for other Societies based on experience

We strongly recommend these kind of exchanges to other societies. We hope to pursue it with the Argentinian societies. A serious project we have is to enlarge these Encounters to all the societies from Argentina and not only those belonging to Buenos Aires; continuing these encounters once every two years. The fact that this encounter was free of charge for the participants and by zoom helps and promotes the participation of colleagues who could not do it otherwise.

We intend to continue these very rich and in-depth colloquiums with our Argentinian colleagues.
